

Taking care of the sewer network in Tay Street & Shore Road – Project Update.

We are continuing our upgrade works to the existing sewer at the bottom of Tay Street at the railway bridge and Shore Road to provide additional capacity to support the city's continuing growth, while also reducing the risk of sewer flooding affecting low-lying areas near the Tay between Muirton and the City Centre. Work onsite has been progressing well.

Update: Tay Street

The reinstatement work at Tay Street was completed by Perth and Kinross Council and partially opened as a cul-de-sac. Entry and Exit is from the junction of Canal Street. Tay Street will remain closed at the Railway Bridge until late spring. The traffic lights have been reactivated at the Canal Street Junction to control flow of traffic in/out of Tay Street North.

During this phase of work in Tay Street

We will be working on the existing live sewer. To enable this work, we require to bypass a section of the main sewer line. By using large pumps and a temporary overland pipe, this will allow us to isolate the section of sewer that we need to work on whilst maintaining wastewater flows through the sewer network, Please note this is weather dependant.

Shore Road Update:

Work is progressing well in Shore Road, and we would like to thank the businesses for their patience and co-operation whilst we continue this section of work. Work will continue at the top end of Shore Road at junction of Marshall Place until late spring.



Shore Road Traffic Management

The 3-way traffic lights in place on Edinburgh Road at the junction with Friarton Road are being manually controlled between the hours of 15:30pm and 17:30pm Monday -Friday. In addition, Cromlix Road will be closed at the junction with Friarton Road during the hours of 15:30PM-17:30PM Monday to Friday to prevent commuters utilising this road as a short cut.

The alternative exit route for HGVs **only** is still in operation via the roadway at the southern edge of the Lesser South Inch. **CCTV** is now in operation to monitor this HGV only route, Please note there is no excuse for abuse, physical or verbal abuse towards our staff will not be tolerated. Please show our site staff the respect they deserve while they are working to upgrade the sewer network. **All incidents will be reported**.

Entry and Exit from the South Inch Car Park is from the bottom end via Friarton industrial estate utilising the previous entry only.

Please note the car park is now Pay and Display as installed and operated by Perth and Kinross Council.
